

COLLEGE OF THE FLORIDA KEYS UPPER KEYS CENTER OPEN FOR LEARNING!

After half a dozen years of championing the cause, we are thrilled to announce that the College of the Florida Keys (CFK) new Upper Keys Center is finally a reality. Prominently positioned at MM106 on the Overseas Highway, the new 38,000 square-foot Upper Keys Center offers bachelor's and associates degrees as well as workforce training opportunities for the people and businesses of north Monroe County.

The new campus, which replaces designated classroom space at Coral Shores High School, provides the necessary space for twice as many students. The UKC features nursing labs, a bio-chemical lab, apprenticeship labs, an auditorium and a Learning Resource Center. It also houses a testing center, which provides access to thousands of professional testing and certification exams.

CFK gave a heartfelt thank you to Friends at Ocean Reef Club, the Ocean Reef Community Foundation, The U.S. Department of Commerce Economic Development Administration, and many more who helped make this big idea become a reality at the Center's on-time grand opening in August.



The Foundation donated \$1 million in 2020 for the center. Our CFK UKC Committee – chaired by **Bill Nutt** and comprised of **Jim Anderton, Michael Berman, Tom Davidson Sr., Alan Goldstein, Ed Hajim, and Steve Markel** – secured an additional \$1.25 million in pledges from generous community members to help make it happen

Sharing his gratitude, CFK President Dr. Jonathan Gueverra said, "This is only the beginning, but it is a beginning that represents hope and opportunity that results in social and economic mobility for our entire upper Keys community. Thanks to our friends from the Ocean Reef Community and the EDA, CFK opened the doors to expanded higher education opportunities in the Upper Keys. CFK is fortunate to have great support from the Ocean Reef Community."

Programs offered in the inaugural semester include nursing, paramedics, business administration, supervision and management, construction technologies, hospitality management, public safety and general studies. Not only will the new campus train local people with skills needed at Ocean Reef and allow existing employees to gain skills, a community that offers affordable higher education attracts and retains motivated, skilled workers and their families. Case in point, ORC Chef Philippe Reynaud attended the opening with his 18-year-old daughter Monique (pictured) who plans to earn her AA at the new campus as part of her path to becoming an elementary school teacher.

CHAIRMAN'S LETTER

It was just over ten years ago when we were all first introduced to the idea that the Club operated on a financial model of a "Three-Legged Stool." This idea was easy to grasp, that the Club's success stemmed from the benefit of having Equity Members, Social Members and Conference Group Business. Mike Sullivan, a past Club Chairman and current ORCA Board Member, took that a step further noting that there was a "Sweet Spot" where the appropriate balance between these three would deliver the best overall Membership experience. With those limits defined, a cap was placed on the amount of group business during the winter season and a Social Member Waitlist began.

Today, this model still delivers the best experience for the Club amenities but it also supports and delivers benefits for a different kind of "Three-Legged Stool," one that is focused on the Community as a whole. Here the three entities the Ocean Reef Club, the Ocean Reef Community Association and the Ocean Reef Community Foundation, work in concert to create a private community like no other.

We see the Club delivering outstanding member experiences in the areas of dining, fishing, yachting, shopping, golf and tennis. Really the family fun events and sporting activities that have earned the Club a recognized distinction as a Platinum Club of America for many years.

At the same time, the Ocean Reef Community Association is focused on the safety and security for the Community, the Members and their families. They manage the ability for our children and grandchildren to drive a golf cart. They ensure safety on the roads for all, respond to a medical or fire emergency in minutes all while keeping a consistent look and feel to the community through the Architectural Committee.

This now brings us to the Ocean Reef Community Foundation. Through the efforts of our All Charities "One Ask, One Give" initiative, we not only support a full slate of dozens of charities in the surrounding communities, we also provide the primary fundraising for a number of non-profits within the community. These deliver the intellectual and cultural experiences to our Membership. Theater, live shows, a museum and library from the Cultural Center, education for our children and grandchildren from the Academy, art and creative learning from the Art League, our health and physical therapy from the Medical Center, protection for our precious surrounding environment through the Conservation Association and even feral

cat management and adoption from ORCAT.

If we were watching a Marvel® Action movie we would see these three organizations as superheroes that come together to deliver something even more powerful, for us it is what the Club appropriately promotes as our Unique Way of Life. And this idea was also formed over ten years ago when Bob Schmetterer, also a past Chairman of the Club and longtime Chairman of the Club's Marketing Committee, wrote the support for our Club's Brand Vision that first talked about this Unique Way of Life including these three organizations.

So much has changed in the last ten years, yet the many traditions and Member passions in our Club and Community remain the same. Chief among them is the desire to do more for the community of Ocean Reef and to make a meaningful difference for the nearby communities where, along with their families, so many of the workers, associates and employees of these three organizations live.

Lately we have seen many wonderful examples of what doing more means. The recent opening of the Upper Keys Center for the College of the Florida Keys that we see featured on our front cover was a meaningful collaboration with the Foundation for financial support and the Club for helping to select the type of classes that could most benefit our current associates, as well as those in the community that could benefit and perhaps become associates of the Club or ORCA in the future.

Another interesting collaboration between the Club, ORCA and the Foundation was also seen in the creation of Greenberg Park. With ORCA's Management and the Club's commitment of funds to build the gazebo on this special bay-front property provided by a generous donation through the Foundation. We also see these collaborations in times of emergencies, such as our comprehensive response to the COVID-19 pandemic, as well. Most recently the earthquake in Haiti had another impact on the lives of many Club Associates and their families that are still living in Haiti. Members already recognize the value these associates bring to their experience here and reached out to the Club and the Foundation to donate in this time of need. The Foundation's Executive Director Yuri Mikolay put together a plan that was focused on healthcare in the hardest hit and remote areas of the Island with high concentrations of employee families. This included vetting select organizations to ensure they had long term stability in Haiti and could begin immediate action if they were funded by the Member's donations through the Foundation.

Your community foundation provides that same level

of research and expertise for our Donor Advised Funds (DAF). We have the long-standing involvement in our local communities and can provide the best advice and counsel on where distributions from your Ocean Reef Community Foundation managed DAF will make the most significant impact toward the causes that matter the most to you. We are likely one of the only community foundations that provides fee free DAFs. It is a wonderful way to benefit from the tax advantages available when opening a DAF, while at the same time ensuring you have the most effective way to connect to the surrounding communities adjacent to Ocean Reef. With no fees even more of your donation can be used to help fund your philanthropic goals.

To do all this does take an ongoing commitment from the Membership. Some Members provide their time in addition to their financial commitment like our Trustees, Board of Directors and Committee Members. This strong volunteer base provides the strength we need to make the right

ORCF PANDEMIC RESPONSE REVIEW

As with the Hurricane Irma relief effort, it started with a phone call from **Rob Daugherty**. The COVID-19 pandemic took hold and took lives, and Members immediately began to come forward with a desire to help and looked to the Ocean Reef Community Foundation to manage the

giving and the grants to assist in the surrounding communities of Monroe County, Florida City and Homestead. It was with great speed and commitment that the Robert B. Daugherty Foundation pledged \$500,000 in matching donations and the COVID-19 Relief Fund was born.

Over the past 12 years I have been blessed to witness the generosity of this community, it is part of the DNA of the Members of Ocean Reef. With that I agreed to chair the COVID-19 Relief Committee comprised of Foundation Board Directors and staff. We wanted to keep it very lean and adept so we could ensure swift disbursement of funds and ensure those donations were applied where they could have the greatest and most needed, immediate impact.

In addition to myself, the Committee members consisted of the Foundation Chairman **Bill Nutt**, Chairman Emeritus **Alan Goldstein**, Grants Committee Chair **Janie Sims**, **Rob Daugherty**, **Teresa Holmes** and the Executive Director **Yuri Mikolay**. And as we had planned, all of the more than 50 grants were unanimously approved within hours.

With the start of the fund and the amazing match opportunity, we quickly saw exponential growth in the donations. It was a scant few weeks from the first donations arriving to the first disbursements taking place. These initial distributions were quickly put to work as stop gap funding for food distribution and basic needs. This assistance took many forms. Florida Keys Outreach Coalition vetted thousands of individual applications for basic needs.



More than a dozen hunger relief agencies were funded to feed families with everything from drive-through food distributions, to grocery gift cards to refrigerated trucks for farm distribution.

Meanwhile the fund continued to grow from seeing close to \$800,000 granted in the first eight months and collecting almost \$1.4 million since its inception to date. With that additional funding and the most basic support to innovative projects like St. Peter's Fleet, which kept fisherman employed and used their catch to feed those in need, while the Keys were closed to all visitors; the Committee began to shift their focus in preparation for the coming vaccine.

With the funding available and the existing relationship with the College of the Florida Keys and their nursing program, plans were offered to these same surrounding communities to support implementation of mass vaccination centers and special vaccine outreach. Vaccination numbers reaching a plateau prompted the Committee to refocus their efforts on combatting vaccine hesitancy and misinformation and championing education. To do so a new partnership was formed with both the Miller School of Medicine at the University of Miami and the United Way. Between these organizations the remaining funds could be better applied to continue the fight against COVID-19 and the growing concerns with the new Delta variant.

The fight is not over, but with the amazing generosity of the Membership along with the operational guidance from the Ocean Reef Community Foundation, we know the number of lives we have touched in the surrounding communities is unsurpassed for such a short timeframe. We also know that these communities are what enrich our lives at Ocean Reef. Whether it is a family member of a Club or ORCA associate, or one of our many other support services such as contractors and caregivers for our families, we are all grateful for the generosity of this Membership, that continues to share the many good fortunes we all enjoy.



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COVID-19 Relief Fund Grants Report

"There's no question that the Ocean Reef Community Foundation's COVID-19 Relief Fund played a critical role in meeting basic needs in the wake of the pandemic and speeding and expanding access to vaccinations and related education in our surrounding communities," according to Executive Director Yuri Mikolay. She credits the close cooperation of dozens of local organizations and county/state officials on weekly calls for both social services and hunger relief agencies for more than a year and half, which continue monthly to this day, to identify constantly changing needs. Relationships and coordination with donors and funders were also key to adequately covering needs countywide. Grants totaling more than \$1.38 million were made over 20+ months, as follows chronologically:

During the shutdown, you provided a safety net with food and emergency financial aid.

2021 ALL CHARITIES EFFORT REPORT

While the circumstances brought on by the COVID-19 Pandemic were daunting for the All Charities team, they were perilous for our neighboring communities and precarious for the institutions that define and sustain Ocean Reef's Unique Way of Life. The Foundation's Grants Committee had more requests than ever before. Enrollment at the Academy and its associates' scholarships almost doubled. The Medical Center expanded its services adding Urgent Care and a vaccination program. The Cultural Center theater sat empty. Non-profits couldn't gather groups together or fundraise. Thanks to the generosity of the Ocean Reef Community, and despite the unprecedented challenges presented by the pandemic, our All Charities recipient partners received at least what they did in 2019 and 2020, and in some cases – most notably the Medical Center and Foundation Community Grants Program – more.




Child Development Center






PATCHES PPEC
