ORCF ISRAEL RELIEF FUND PROVIDING HUMANITARIAN AID

n response to a wave of outreach following the October 7th terrorist attacks, the Ocean Reef Community Foundation Israel Relief Fund was created to provide humanitarian aid to Israel and a conduit for members to stand together with the Jewish community. Within a month of the horrific attacks, \$300,000 in grants had already been distributed to our three non-profit partners and, as we were going to press, a second round of grants totaling \$120,000 went out ahead of the December 7 start of Chanukah.

ORCF Chairman Bill Nutt emphasized, "This is certainly about the funding, but it is not all about the funding. It's about saying something loudly of our support for Israel, and finding a meaningful way to benefit those who have been so badly harmed, in spirit as well as physically."

He notes that when there is a crisis outside the scope of our local All Charities effort, such as the disasters in Haiti that touched so many Ocean Reef employee families, the Foundation offers members a thoughtful and effective way to respond as a community. The Foundation is working alongside the interfaith Chapel congregations to coordinate such a response and show support for the local Jewish congregation, who are so deeply personally affected.

The Israel Relief Fund administered by the Foundation Executive Committee benefits the following slate of well-established, expert relief organizations, which may change as needs evolve.

Greater Miami Jewish Federation - \$300,000

One hundred percent of our first grant of \$200,000 went directly to support their Israel Emergency Fund's broad scope of humanitarian aid efforts including:

- Fund for Victims of Terror, providing grants and critical supplies to individuals and families devastated by the violence
- Emergency medical services, including essential supplies and equipment for first responders and hospitals on the front line
- Evacuation, housing, respite and support for frontline communities under fire
- Trauma relief and psychological care for first responders; the injured; families whose relatives were murdered, injured or abducted; caregivers; and hospital emergency teams
- Support to vulnerable populations, including homebound elderly, young children, people with disabilities and others at risk in the ongoing conflict

An additional grant of \$100,000 went primarily to the Israel Emergency Fund with measured grants designated to support Chanukah initiatives for displaced families.

The Isaiah Projects - \$85,000

This organization is working directly on the frontlines in Israel and is run by friend of the Ocean Reef Chapel, and founder of the Center for Jewish-Christian Understanding and Cooperation, David Nakrutman. Our first grant of \$75,000 is helping to rebuild the lives of the survivors of Kibbutz Be'eri, a community which suffered more than 100 brutal murders and untold hostages taken. The houses on the compound were burned and have severe structural damage from grenades and artillery, leaving the families with nothing. The Isaiah Projects is helping to supply household necessities for more than 100 displaced families, including 350 children. An additional grant of \$10,000 was made ahead of Chanukah, with half going to fund efforts to uplift families with parents who are away serving in the military on the front lines of the war during the holiday.

American Friends of Magen David Adom - \$35,000

Two grants totaling \$35,000 went to support the MDA, the Israeli equivalent of the Red Cross, which operates blood drives, manages the blood supply for hospitals treating the inured and supports medical first responders providing lifesaving treatment 24 hours a day. They also are responding to the increased need for tested and processed breast milk tor babies whose mothers have been killed, injured, kidnapped, or called to IDF reserve duty.

ORCF 2023 OFF REEF COMMUNITY GRANTS TOP \$2 MILLION

hanks to the Ocean Reef community's generosity, the Ocean Reef Community Foundation's annual grants program provided more than \$2 million in funding to charities outside the gate for the first time. Support for the annual "Off Reef" grants first topped \$1 million in 2017 and jumped to more than \$1.5 million for the first time in 2021, just two years ago.

According to Grants Committee Chair Janie Sims, "This new record reflects the outstanding philanthropic spirit of the Ocean Reef community and our shared desire to help in surrounding communities."

The Community Grants program funds scores of worthy charities in the interest areas of Education, Youth, Health & Family Services, and Community in the Upper Keys, Homestead, and Florida City each spring. Including 2023 grants, the program will have awarded more than \$16.3 million since the Foundation's All Charities effort to consolidate fundraising in the Ocean Reef community began in 2008.

After months of careful vetting of applications by a Grants Committee of your peers, the Foundation's share of 2023 All Charities proceeds not reserved for larger Impact Fund projects was distributed, combined with record donations directly to the Community Grants Fund, as follows:
