And the Winners Are...

Of the many wonderful events that take place during All Charities Weekend one of the Members' favorites is voting on what new wines will be featured property-wide on all wine lists. As in year's past, there were 10 white wines and 10 red wines to choose from. It was a wonderful turnout last Friday, keeping up with Ocean Reef traditions. So here are your 2026 All Charities Wines:

2023 Stags' Leap Chardonnay, Napa Valley

In 1872, the Grigsby family consolidated a 700-acre parcel

where the current Stags' Leap estate resides and planted grapes on the land. With various owners through the years, in 1996 the property was sold to Beringer, now Treasury Wine Estates. Shortly after, construction began on a 28,000 sq. ft. wine cave in the volcanic rhyolite rock of the Stags Leap Palisades. The new cave is a companion to the original cave built in 1893, but it is much larger at almost 700 feet deep with 17 cross areas and room for 7,000 barrels. As one of California's earliest wine estates, a unique terroir and ideal microclimate support a classical standard of viticulture, land use, and winemaking that is as relevant today as it was over a century ago. An intimate valley within the greater Napa Valley, Stags' Leap is a 240-acre estate, of which 85-acres are planted with grape vines. Boasting a glorious shimmering golden hue, with bright and lively aromatic notes of lemon crème, white pineapple, and melon.

Delicate citrus blossoms and magnolia flowers add a floral elegance on the nose. The ripe and full palate offers flavors of Golden Delicious apples, Asian pear, and lemon curd. Spiced oak notes of vanilla, brioche toast, and ginger complement the fruit, while exotic floral notes provide a lovely perfume. Full-bodied with a creamy texture, the finish is long and satisfying, highlighted by hints of lychee and a beautiful mineral character.

2021 Decoy Limited Red Blend, Alexander Valley

Established in 1985, the first Decoy Red Blend is made at Duckhorn Vineyards. This exceptional wine quickly established a loyal following for its great quality, and its distinctive style, which expresses its full charm and complexity in its youth.

Through the years Decoy has grown to include varieties like Cabernet Sauvignon, Pinot Noir, Chardonnay and

Sauvignon Blanc. In 2012 and 2013 after working with sought-after grapes, they acquired the renowned Ridgeline Vineyard and the Brownell Vineyard in the Alexander Valley appellation, which produce some of the best Bordeaux varieties. Then in 2020, building on their rich heritage, Decoy Limited was created. Crafted using grapes from some of the most acclaimed Napa Valley and Sonoma Coast vineyards, including their own estate properties, these wines showcase the pinnacle of Decoy winemaking. This refreshingly balanced Red Blend treats your senses to voluptuous flavors of black raspberry, cherry, cassis, sweet French oak and exotic spice. The generous addition of Merlot brings smooth tannins and Cabernet Sauvignon enhances its juicy ripe berry flavors.
